

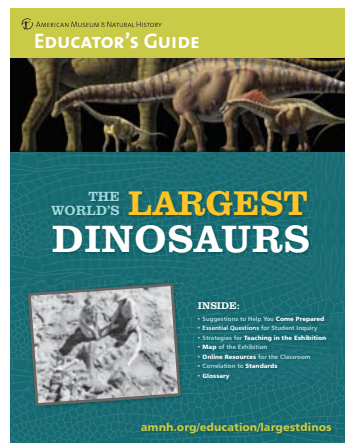
EDUCATORS' EVENING: The World's Largest Dinosaurs
